PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Thank you for your ongoing patience and understanding with the ongoing COVID situation. Currently we have a larger number of students in Year 10 who have reported positive test results. A couple of weeks ago we had several teaching staff unwell and had to implement a system of minimal supervision in the Hall. The students were given work from their class teachers and have been supervised by one of the Deputy Principals or myself with other support staff. I have been working closely with the Health and Safety Directorate and our Director Educational Leadership on the best options to support our students and to ensure continuity of learning. All staff and students in the Special Education faculty have had to wear masks indoors and we are continually monitoring the number of students and staff who are testing positive.

Students and staff who are close contacts are able to attend school as long as they are well, test negative each morning for five school days and wear a mask indoors for five school days. Additional Rapid Antigen Tests (RAT) have been given to students and if you require more please just ask at the office. We are continuing to practice good hand hygiene including the use of hand sanitizer, physical distance when we can and have windows open for ventilation in all learning spaces although this is more difficult with the cold weather we are experiencing. Most importantly, thank you for keeping your children home when they are sick and using the Rapid Antigen Tests already distributed for symptomatic testing. I have continued to wear a mask at work and support other staff and students as we continue to have a layered approach to keeping safe and healthy. I appreciate your support as we navigate this ongoing situation.

Unfortunately, we will continue to have issues as we are already experiencing the cold and flu season as well as the complications brought about by the COVID pandemic. Our teachers and staff are working above expectations to ensure continuity of learning for our students. We will continue to merge some classes as staff are isolating or unwell and we are unable to source casual teachers. If necessary we will implement Minimal Supervision as we did a couple of weeks ago.

NAIDOC Assembly: Our NAIDOC Assembly last Friday was a wonderful celebration of the academic, sporting and cultural achievements of our Aboriginal students both at school and in our community. We will have more information in our next newsletter.

Special Guest: Last week we welcomed Caitlin Cronin, Tokyo Olympic medalist in Rowing, to our school. Caitlin spoke to our students and presented the school with a rowing machine which was sponsored by Coles. Rowing Australia have given our school 10 places in the National Age Indoor Rowing Championships. Some of our students had the opportunity to use the rowing machine and were a little surprised at just how difficult it is to row quickly! We will have to practice before the competition!

Extra-curricula Opportunities: Our staff are working above and beyond to continue giving our students extra-curricula opportunities. Last week our students participated in a Rugby League Gala Day, Hockey Knockouts, Open Boys Football, Rugby and our Special Education students travelled to Orange to play Boccia.

Mental Health Expo: On Monday our Years 10, 11 and 12 students will attend a Mental Health Expo at Parkes RSL club, facilitated by a number of Parkes and national organisations. Sam Webb, the founder of "Livin" is flying in from LA to be the keynote speaker on the day. Our Head Teacher PDHPE and Sport, Joe Spicer will be speaking as the town ambassador for this initiative. Our students will attend between 11am and 1pm, listening to speaker and accessing the variety of Mental Health organisations and professionals present for the Expo.

Vaping: I am very concerned that a small number of students are vaping. Vaping is a serious health issue as it is a risk to both physical and mental health. Vapes can contain the harmful chemicals found in cleaning products, nail polish remover, weed spray and insect spray. These chemicals can have long term detrimental effects on your lungs, reproductive organs and lead to birth defects. Vapes are designed to appeal to young people with the flavours and colourful packaging however many also contain nicotine which is very addictive. Selling vapes to young people is illegal. Students were given a fact sheet last week from the NSW Department of Health.

Written Permission: All excursions and activities that are off school grounds, including our carnivals, require us to have written permission from parents or care givers. We are now required to have informed consent from parents and caregivers for any activity or presentation within school grounds that is not a usual aspect of day to day classroom teaching or curriculum. The Skool Bag App has supported us as we develop strategies to gain the required permissions for students to attend excursions safely.







Do You Know What They Are Vaping ?

We are **Encouraging Parents and Carers** to find out more and talk about the hidden impacts of vapes with your children. Alarmingly, we are seeing an increase in the number of young people trying vaping.

Young people may think they are simply inhaling flavoured water, this is far from the truth. Vapes can have the same harmful chemicals found in cleaning products, nail polish remover, weed killer and bug spray.

Vapes are colourful, with flavours that make them appealing. You wouldn't put cleaning products in your food, so why would you want to put it into your lungs?

What you can do as a parent or carer

There are ways you can help protect your children from vaping: Whether you suspect your child is vaping or not, take the time to talk to them about it and help them understand all of the risks. It is never too late to have the conversation.

- Try to start the conversation with your child in a relaxed easy-going way, perhaps taking the cue from around you, such as a note from school, a news story about on it, or seeing people vaping on the street.
- If your child is vaping, encourage them to stop, let them know that help is available and you are there for them.
- Learn about the different types of vapes available and the risks associated with using these products.
- Set a good example by being tobacco or vape free.
- Report those who are selling vapes to minors or selling vapes containing nicotine by completing the online reporting form or calling the Tobacco Information Line on 1800 357 412.
