

Students Attend Sydney University - Gadalung Program Jessica Towns, Makayla Sloane, Brock Charlton and Savannah Ross attended a weeklong program at The University of Sydney. The Gadalung residential program is for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students in Years 11 - 12 in 2023, who want to explore their future at university. This program gives students the chance to experience university life, live on-campus in a college, explore world-class facilities and meet current university students. Students will learn useful skills for their final years at school and get a heads up for their future at university and beyond. Here is a report by Jess: The program was very good, all the people were nice and welcoming, and the other kids were also nice and supportive. There were over 100 students and when we got there, we had lunch and were shown our rooms then we went to a smoking ceremony and welcome. On the second day we had faculty taster sessions, so we went to different buildings and were spoken to by students doing the courses and they gave us interactive activities to do. We went to a science lab and did experiments with micro pipettes, and we went to the music and drama theatre and met an opera singer. The next day we did more faculty tasters including education, law, and economics. That night we attended a concert. The next day we had a talk about finance, scholarships, and support facilities. On the last day we had a wrap up talk and a graduation where we received a certificate and a little koala with a graduate hat on. Afterwards, we had a going away party where an indigenous group performed.

Behaviour code for students NSW public schools

NSW public schools are committed to providing safe, supportive and responsive learning environments for everyone. We teach and model the behaviours we value in our students.

In NSW public schools students are expected to:

- Respect other students, their teachers and school staff and community members
- Follow school and class rules and follow the directions of their teachers
- Strive for the highest standards in learning
- Respect all members of the school community and show courtesy to all students, teachers and community members
- Resolve conflict respectfully, calmly and fairly
- Comply with the school's uniform policy or dress code
- Attend school every day (unless legally excused)
- Respect all property
- Not be violent or bring weapons, illegal drugs, alcohol or tobacco into our schools
- Not bully, harass, intimidate or discriminate against anyone in our schools

Schools take strong action in response to behaviour that is detrimental to self or others or to the achievement of high quality teaching and learning.

Behaviour Code for Students: Actions

Promoting the learning, wellbeing and safety of all students in NSW Public Schools is a high priority for the Department of Education.

We implement teaching and learning approaches to support the development of skills needed by students to meet our high standards for respectful, safe and engaged behaviour.

Respect

- Treat one another with dignity
- Speak and behave courteously
- Cooperate with others
- Develop positive and respectful relationships and think about the effect on relationships before acting
- Value the interests, ability and culture of others
- Dress appropriately by complying with the school uniform or dress code
- Take care with property

Safety

- Model and follow departmental, school and/or class codes of behaviour and conduct
- Negotiate and resolve conflict with empathy
- Take personal responsibility for behaviour and actions
- Care for self and others
- Avoid dangerous behaviour and encourage others to avoid dangerous behaviour

Engagement

- Attend school every day (unless legally excused)
- Arrive at school and class on time
- Be prepared for every lesson
- Actively participate in learning
- Aspire and strive to achieve the highest standards of learning

The principal and school staff, using their professional judgment, are best placed to maintain discipline and provide safe, supportive and responsive learning environments. The department provides a policy framework and resources such as Legal Issues Bulletins, access to specialist advice, and professional learning to guide principals and their staff in exercising their professional judgment. In this context the NSW Government and the Department of Education will back the authority and judgment of principals and school staff at the local level.
